The artist Jakob Jenzer from Steffisburg/Switzerland worked and lived from July through December 2007 in Varanasi (India). The stay was possible through a grant given by the city of Thun and the conference of Swiss cities for cultural affairs (KSK) to spend 6 months at Kriti Gallery Residency in Banaras.

During his stay Jakob Jenzer had the idea to translating his paintings into sound impressions at various locations where his paintings and art work developed originally.

In cooperation with the musician Raphael Zehnder who origins from the city of Thus as well, they created the idea of a concert to encounter cultural exchange between Indian and Western musicians.

This is how they create a bridge of music for both cultures where original music instruments will be heard like Sitar – Shehnai -Tabla - Alphorn, Trumpet, Saxophone, Guitar

The project «Colors of Sound – Music Bridge» represents a special experience for people interested on both sides. There are influences for both countries, Switzerland and India, for many years there are encounters in the areas of commerce, medicine, politics. There is a raising interest in Switzerland to also learn and hear about Indian music and culture.

In cooperation with Navneet Raman, curator of Kriti Gallery and convenor of Intach (Indian National Trust for Art and Cultural Heritage) in Varanasi we built the concept of a series of concerts between December, 4th through 14th. The locations are in a direct context with the paintings created by Jakob Jenzer. The concerts will be documented, there will be a publication of a CD which will be accompanied by a booklet designed by Jakob Jenzer consisting of photographs, sketches and experiences.

The project «Colors of Sound – Music Bridge» is a wonderful challenge for all artists participating the audience will benefit from this effort.

Exchange and dialog between the cultures through music, paintings, photography and encounter of people is enabled by the sponsorship through the cultural programs in Switzerland and India. The musicians are selected based on their experiences with other cultural exchange programs, so music and dialog are the key criterias. The selection of young and highly talented as well as senior and experienced musicians is a creative mixture with direct influence on the project «Colors of Sound – Music Bridge». The compositions and improvisations of all musicians and artists will help to melt the cultures.



Born 25th May 1965




